The Whakarewa is my father's name of Whakarewa
and I was at the time. I will now give an account
of my father's land. It formerly belonged to
Te Whakarewa and the Whakarewa conquered it.
(The) land generally about (the) and cut the
land up, and my father Mata Whakarewa obtained
this piece before the court were the occupied, cultivated
it, and when he died he left it to the Whakarewa (the) and
the Whakarewa (the) occupied it, and
cultivating Kumeras, taro, etc, and the land
our time. We have been seen cultivating taro, and it
was on that account that we consider the land belong
to us. When he died, he gave the land to Whakarewa
was then at that time a chief, and the land remained
with it, the occupation was having been disputed.

feast and it built on that occasion a house on the
land and was to give a feast there on different times
occasions (4 times), and all the people who came to
these feasts made no objection to his occupation of this
piece. After this time, he erected a house also on this
piece, and made a request to the people to bring their
grain to them to be stored; so that he might know the
quantity grown by the tribe, and he would sell the
produce to Europeans to erect a flour-mill whararua.
He received £600 for wheat sold, and informed the
people that he had a sufficient sum in hand to purchase
a mill whiri. In 1870 Mr Kelly purchased, and J. M. Kelly
leased this piece of land to him, no more making any ob-
jection, the whole tribe being aware of this lease. After
leaving the land, he died, and another European, James
Manua Oballer, took the land and was raised a second
time, no objection was made either on this occasion.
- James Malinga died in 1880, and a man took the money
to rent this piece on account of the whiri being ^{being} whiri
and Malinga the elder whiri (his name). No one objected to his
management. The European who is living on it has an
old house, and he asked me if I would get this piece surveyed
so that he might get a legal title to this piece, and build a
a new whiri house, and he would I have no objection
provided you can do away with the old lease and build
a new one, and he consented and had the lease renewed.
I then ordered a survey of this piece and informed the
people of it, and they interposed in adjoining pieces, came
to witness the survey. The Court then said that I should
surveying it, and the person who owns the land
adjacent approved of my surveying it surveyed, in fact none

Waiver Judgment

The Court after retiring for a few minutes returned, and intimated that it did not consider *Hini Hini* has proved anything at all, and it therefore awarded the land to *Hini*, Claimant *Whakakau-Kawa*, at the same time, ordering *Hini* to stand in the list of names
