Friend, salutations to you.

Thus as a prayer of mine to you that you would
grant a rehearing of my block Case No. 1,
by virtue of Section 75 of the Native Land Court
Act, 1888. Great trouble has overtaken me
and the two hapus whose case I conducted in
the Court at Orotiki, Ngatipatu and Ngati-
kallimatahi. Do not send Judge Wilson as a
Judge for the Court, as it was through him
that the misfortune has overtaken me and
my two hapus, had it not been for him so great
a misfortune would probably not have come upon
us. I will go fully into the error of Judge
Wilson in the investigation of my block when the
rehearing Court sits. What was the cause of the
word of Judge Wilson in his judgment when he
said that Ruamoko was the companion of
Whatape in laying off the boundary. This appears
in the books of the blocks of the four cases that
were opposing me. My word is that Te
Hauotirangi was the companion of Te
Whatape in laying off the boundary. It was
in a subsequent conquest of Te Whatape by
