- ✓2. A certificate under the hand of the Registrar of the Waiariki Maori Land Court to the effect that Mamai Apaapa and Mamae Apaapa are one and the same person must be filed.
- ✓3. The seal of the Maori Land Court must be affixed at the foot of the certificate of confirmation. The seal of the Maori Land Board is not sufficient for this purpose.
- ✓4. The blank space on page one of the instrument should be completed.
- ✓5. The last part on page one and all of pages 4 and 5 should be deleted. The deletion should be initialled by the parties or be sealed by the Maori Land Court.

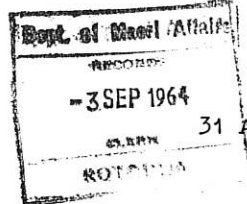
