Sir I have the honor to inclose application for survey of the Hiwarau Block Ohuwa Parish of Waioatah (Opotika Survey District.) Approximately 1000 acres, situated upon the Ohuwa Harbor. The Block has been subdivided into two Subdivisions by the Native Land Court and my wife and other owners are now anxious to have the Block surveyed in time for a sitting of the Native Land Court at Opotika in June next (for further Partitioning)

We therefore ask the Surveyor General to allow the Survey to be made in time for further partitioning in June next.

We also ask the Surveyor General to overlook the fact that we have not been able to inclose with this application a map showing the positions of the two Subdivisions as laid down by the Native Land Court.
