



Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of yours of I5th. inst. enclosing Mr. King's letter re Hiwirau and I shall try again to elucidate the matter.

Harris. I did not survey the sub-divisions, they were already surveyed band orders of Court made for them. All I did was to simply run a line dividing the Block or lot numbered Pt. B No. 3 - which was awarded to two persons - one of which was transferring his rights to Mr. Harris - so that it was not a Native Lend Court survey at all, but a Land Transfer to enable Mr. Harris to acquire his title to that particular piece.

Where the bulk of the work, however, came in was in the compiling Mr. Harris' other leases from original surveys which took me upwards of 3 weeks to do. These were surveyed by Mr. Reardon. I think you will now quite understand the position.

You will see by my account that I only charged £6:6:0 for the survey that I did, the rest is for office work in compiling the other leases which are all now inmorder and have been sent away a fortnight ago - so that I am quite within my rights.

If the above sub-division line had required an authority, I should have applied for it but it didn't as it was not a Native Land Court survey.
