Raiwara A Block - Succs. to Mahanga
Mokomoko, deceased.

With reference to the attached matter,
the difficulty in this case is the identity of Raiwara
Mahanga.

Mahanga Mokomoko was an owner in this
block by succs. to Hira Puke, Kokeke Te Ani and Isera Sutahi
On the 20th October, 1915 a succs. order to Mahanga
Mokomoko was made in favour of the following (See
Opaliki M.B. 23 Page 239.)

in the 1915 order.

From my perusal of the attached correspond-
ence and referring to Mr. Nikora's evidence (Es. M.B. 62 Page 167).
the above order does not provide for the inclusion of another
child of Mahanga's by a first husband. The name of this
child is Urumotu or Raiwara Hemaia now Mrs Karaka
Wara. It would seem from Mr. Nikora's whatakapapa
that all the above successors are the children by the second
husband, providing of course that Te Raiwara Mahanga is
the same as Henerata Kokiri or Mahanga. This would eliminate
Urumotu or Raiwara Hemaia, who claims that she is the
same person as Te Raiwara Mahanga.

The succe. order of 13/12/1934 to Te Aorangi te Putu or Mahanga was made at Gisborne (M.B. 61/214) evidently on the evidence of Urumotu Hevemaia, who assumed perhaps that she, the deceased, was her full sister. But it was not until Mrs Tom Brown wrote in under cover of letter dated 9/1/36, that this office was aware that the Te Aorangi Putu or Mahanga was still alive. I therefore wrote the Registrar, Gisborne on the 16th January, 1936, ~~and~~ to have the papers which were also forwarded, placed before you for your directions. ~~The~~ The result was that you declared the above order as a nullity. See your note of 27/1/36.

This is correct
In the meantime Mrs. Karaka Wani drew ~~sent~~ under the name of Te Raiwhara Mahanga from this Board for this block. This was on the 20/9/33 and the amount involved was £14:13:2. She also drew ^{a similar} (this) amount ~~as~~ as succe. to Te Aorangi Mahanga above on the 30/4/35. *This was wrong*
In both cases she happened to be passing through Rotorua and she signed by mark both times.

About Easter of this year, Hana Mahanga called in to this office and wished to have an application for succe. to her mother, Heneriala Mahanga, in this block lodged. On searching the Hivaraun file however, she could not find Heneriala's name, but she found the rest of her mother's brothers and sisters. She informed me that her mother was not known as Te Raiwhara; and she does not remember her being called that as her mother died while she was quite a young child. Hana Mahanga lives at Waitiki, Gisborne.

Owing to this then, I ~~had~~ wrote my memo. of 24/7/36 to the Registrar, Gisborne, to have the matter of establishing Te Raiwhara Mahanga's identity inquired into. Hivaraun A block is leased. Court file, appln. file and Op. M.B. 23 herewith.

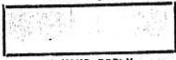

Re your application for identification
of Raiwhara Mahanga.

The evidence of Mrs. Karaka Waru only was taken at Tolaga Bay. Mrs. Brown was not present. From this evidence that of Mr. Nikora and Hana Mahanga's statement to you it is clear that

Raiwhara Mahanga is Urumotu or Raiwhara Heremaia now Mrs. Karaka Waru. She wrongly succeeded her half sister Aorangi Mahanga (Mrs. Tom Brown) on the belief that Aorangi was her full sister after whom Mrs. Brown was named.

The succession order of 21/10/15 re Mahanga Mokomoko deceased needs amending. Mahanga had six children, one of whom, Heneriata, died leaving Hana Kokiri or Mahanga who has been omitted from succession. Hana would be entitled to 1/6 of the interest or 25/36 of a share and the five others reduced to a like share.

Mrs. Karaka Waru should refund the £14.13. 2. drawn and due to Mrs. Brown. If possible the omission of Hana Kokiri or Mahanga should be provided for and adjusted in the distribution of rents.
