Hapeta Kotu was succeeded by Ani Kotu 1/5, Wi Kotu 1/5, Hinehou Kotu 1/5 and Henare Te Aramoana 2/5. The last named also succeeded to Wi Kotu. Allotment 190 was on the 14th March 1941 partitioned amongst the Maori owners.
