Confiscated Land Regulations
- May 1871 -

Sections 40. 41. 42. Any person wanting to construct a road or bridge or other work of public utility and of being allowed payment for it in land must apply to the Commissioner who, on being satisfied with the plans and specifications may authorize the work.

When the work is completed and has been passed, the person who did it is to receive Land scrip to the extent of one half the value of the work

Sec. 43. This Land scrip is to be received any time within three months of date of issue, and can be exercised over General Rural Land open for sale or selection in the District, Block, or County where the work is situated

Sec. 44. 45 No greater sum is to be paid
in land scrip to any one person
than £300 in one year; and
the particulars of the work
and of the land scrip, are to
be published in the Gazette.

Sec 47. Excludes the Province of
Auckland from above
