

Terms of Reference - Project Manager

The Project Manager must not commit Whakatohea to a binding position in any matter which materially affects the settlement of the Whakatohea claim, without the express approval of the Whakatohea Raupatu Negotiating Committee ("the Committee").

The Project Manager should take appropriate steps to ensure the rights of Whakatohea are protected in respect of the actions and activities of the Crown and its various agencies.

The Project Manager should take appropriate steps to ensure the rights of Whakatohea are protected in respect of the actions and activities any person or persons claiming to represent Whakatohea in respect of the Whakatohea treaty claim.

The Project Manager must operate within the limits of a budget approved by the Committee.

The Project Manager must provide full and up to date financial reports to every meeting of the Committee, but no more than once a month unless specifically requested to do so by the Committee.

The Project Manager must not meet with any Minister of the Crown on any matter that affects the Whakatohea treaty claim unless accompanied by at least two members of the Committee.

The Project Manager will ensure that the Committee's Standing Orders are complied with.

The Project Manager shall work to a "Work Plan" approved by the Committee.
