Now I say that ... because unless that Bill is in place ... Te Tai (muffled) and there is not a mechanism for us to do our job ... which is to transfer resources to Iwi ... and how I'm doing it ... so that's why that Bill is important for Te Tai ... I think its also very

important for Iwi because ... we cannot waste anymore months ... ah ... waiting until we sort out whether in fact the Bill tramples ah ... those things that we hold dear ... or whether in fact there's a traversity of (muffled) in terms of the Treaty of Waitangi ... or that ... I'm a productive person and then I should be pragmatic and therefore I think we've got to move ... within whatever magnus we've got ... as long as we are taking paces forwards and ... never moving ... and I think if we sit on our dignity too long ... we will be moved backwards ... so having said that, let me just describe to you a 3-hase operation ... which I will occur in the next 12 months ...

The first phase is what we describe as the ... pre-operational phase. If you think this is sounding quite (muffled) you're quite right ... phase 1 is the pre-operational phase, phase 2 ... is the operational phase ... and phase 3 ... is the monetary and review phase ... Now, let me tell you what that means ...

Phase 1 is occurring right now ... so in the next 3 months a number of things have to occur ... for those people who wish to participate in the Runanga a Iwi Act I should say that the Act will be permissive ... that is you can join ... or you don't have to join ... but if you wish to join and register yourselves as an Iwi Authority ... including the characteristics of an Iwi ... ah ... which are in the draft of the Bill by and large to the

tribe ... which you can identify with a common ancestor ... should have a generally recognised area which you occupy ... and that you have a number of operating marae ... Now I don't think that each question arrived in Whakatohea existed (muffled) ... but what has to be decided in Whakatohea ... and the rohe of Whakatohea is how it actually intends that Iwi Authority ... what you actually need to to be ...

There are a number of combination of ways of becoming an Iwi Authority but that is for you to decide ... if it is operating within the existing Interim Iwi Authority ... that is the Trust Board ... or you can set up a completely new organisation ... a Runanga ... or you can combine the two ... or you can do whatever you like ... as long as whatever organisation you come up with ... it has the will of iwi behind it ... and so that ... that if you're not learning anymore with your choices ... that you really haven't got too long to do it ... because with other ... other factors you should be considering right now ... which should ... you should try and be in by the 1st July ... and the sorts of things that a potentially new Iwi Authority should be doing ... I'll just list the general things ... some of them you will ... you will know that you're doing them right now ... there are organisational issues ... there are planning ... there are planning issues ... there are staffing issues ... which you must be considering right now ... and I talked about the organisation

... how you want to structure yourself ... I don't think you can wait too much longer ... going back to the 1st of July and have your hui-a-iwi to decide what Whakatohea is going to be ... because you'll be losing months ... I'll explain to you why ... its important that you move as soon as possible ... to begin to collect your resources ... to collect your things together ... to determine the plan that you wish ... to operate ...

(cough) ... now that you should be considering the planning ... and no doubt ... the fact that this group is meeting ... means that your got the planning process underway right now ... now the chances starting ... you Iwi Authority whatever it is ... it is before we even (muffled) that you must have right ... you can cock up organisation ... you can cock up its name and you cock up staffing ... and you will go no where ... unless you have the critical staff members who are the right ... and the best people for the job then you will not be (muffled) and I'm not saying that because I happen to know organisation its my business to get here ... but we've discovered a survey on the Iwi Authorities ... that have been operating Maccess and Mana for 4 or 5 years ... and a number of those authorities ... I wouldn't pay tuppence for ... to proceed to the next stage of Iwi Authority status ... and one people ... are not common to do the job ... and there is a message that I lead in this phase I issue is ... the competency of the people to do the job ...

Now let's say you achieve all that and you've probably got it all sorted out in your minds ... and ah ... know where you're gonna go ... what Te Tira Ahu Iwi can do, is not a great deal at this stage, but you're gonna have a great deal of funding ... for this phase I .. we can assist in some hui ... we can assist in some policy planning ... we can assist with ah ... not coming in any great order ... but we're heading up to the critical stage and that's this stage here ... and that's the operation phase ... now if you're ready ... with all these things from phase 1 ... theoretically by the 1st of July you should be able to register ... whatever the mechanism that is in place .. now it might not be the Maori Land Court ... the submissions are read by the select committee and how they direct their attention ... but whatever mechanism is in place lets say from the 1st of July Whakatohea fronts up and registers ... now that's step one ... There is a second step now that is a step ... where Whakatohea ... the Iwi Authority for Whakatohea negotiates with Te Tai ... you negotiate with us for the following things; for establishment grant, training funding and things like professional fees and a whole bunch of things like that ... and what we are saying in Te Tai is this ... we're saying fairly dearly ... that we have a responsibility to Whakatohea to ... provide you with sufficient funding ... to establish an executive group capable of managing the complex operation of ... group capable of managing the complex operation of ... Whakatohea which

involves government funding ...

And we believe that their establishment costs ... doesn't matter now sophisticated you are ... right now you still have establishment costs ... because in order to manage the Government funding ... lets say we've got Maccess, Mana, Vocational Trade Training (muffled) lets say we take on 5 or 6 government programmes to deliver ... on behalf on government ... you will need a management structure on top of all the programmes ... because right now with many of the times what's happening is that they're pinching out of Mana, they're pinching out of Maccess funding as well ... that's basically what's happening right now ... people have been caught stealing money out of existing fundings ... and that's not good enough ... we should be able to provide you with that resource ... we also believe that there should be an operational cost that we at Te Tai provide you ... (muffled) so Whakatohea registers on the 1st of July and we negotiate over the next month about the size of the resource to give you ... in order to assist you in your operations ... and once you agree to the cost of the annual operations of ... the national assistance to run the programme ... we believe it should be available to you for at least the next four years ...

In addition, we think that ... there will be a significant training cost ... for Whakatohea in training the people ... to

manage the activities ... for various programmes ... finally ... it is not cheap to establish an annual system as you well know ... Claude and those of the Trust Board members will know ... if you are going to negotiate contracts with Social Welfare, Labour Department, Justice and Te Tai and anyone else ... you need legal fees ... you need accounting fees ... now those are costs which should come as part of the ... initial package to Whakatohea in addition you're gonna need some consultancy advice to sharpen your act up in a few things ... tidy up the whole thing ... so phase 2 sent us to establish this part which is to negotiate the rights for the establishment of your operations ... Now, look at those down the track ... there's another part to it and that is the Whakatohea can come to us and say yeah ... we're set up ... we're going we're managing the programmes ... now we're actually had limited resources in Whakatane and Rotorua ... (muffled) staff there and we need some more resources ... and we want to negotiate with you about what additional things that we need for Whakatohea ... So if their staff we need with the rohe of Whakatohea from Te Tai which are supporting Whakatohea ... that might be your're first thing you might say; look we know you've seconded a couple of people here to work for with Whakatohea we want _____ people we want them now ... so that's another process we got to negotiate through ... finally phase 3 ... is once you're you're done your homework you become registrar you're negotiated in sales and costs then comes to ____
