Koina te whenua a Takupapa)

Te wa e huri ana nea hoia a te Kawana,
No Te Arawa te nuinpa. E noho noaiho ana'
a Kahungunu. I Konei.

Ka mea a Te Kooti Kia whakatuhia he
marae ma ratou.

Ka whakaaro ratou Kia whakatuhia Ki
Kukumoa. Ka Kii atu a Te Kooti Kao, tawhiti
atu i te rohe (Tuhoe). Na Ka whakatuhia
a Moekahu (wharenui) Ki Waiotahē.

Ana ka Kii a Te Kooti. "Tera te wa ka
hoki mai ahau ki te whakakaupapa i waku
Korero" Kia matemai ki tana Korero
Anei tana korero,

"Manaaikiha nea iwi haere
hei iwi mo Koutou." (Pupuri)

I Waiotahē a Te Kooti e tapuke ana, ka whanakotia.
No waho te nuinpa o nea tangata mate, kei
te urupa i Waiotahē.

No mua mai nei, ka hanapai te whare e kite
ana koe i tenei ra. "Te Poho o Kahungunu."

Ko te whare nei, "Te Poho o Kahungunu"
he tapenekara ke. E hara i te wharewhakair
Koina, kaore koe e kite nea whakāhua e
iri ana i roto i te whare.

Kaitiaki

Theres a Kaitiaki just above Te Huinpas*
place. Its a Hinau tree. If you go there you
will see that it looks as though it has been
swept with a manuka broom.

It has been said by *Te Rua if this
was ever Knocked down there would be no
Kai in the Waiotahē river right down to
no pipi at te ahiaua. (Waiotahē beach).

* TE RUA (RUA KENANA)

* Moekahu was the name of one of Taneatuas dogs.

* Te Huinpas place is up the Waiotahē Valley.
