

OLD PA SITES OF TE UPOKOREHE

- HOKIANGA: A pa on Hokianga isle in Ohiwa harbour, Te Upokorehe under Paihau, lived there.
- HIWARAU: A Ngati Karatehe pa at Ohiwa, on mainland opposite Hokianga isle.
- HAUAURU: Inland of Te Wainui, Ohiwa, said to be an old Whakatohea pa.
- O-HEU: A Ngati-Raka and Ngati-Karatehe pa near Kutarere at Ohiwa. See Te Mauku.
- ONE-KAWA: An ancient pa on the hill just east of Ohiwa ferry. Rongopopoia lived there.
- ORONA: An Upokorehe pa, at Waiotahe, near the Tuhua pa.
- OTORE: A Whakatohea pa on the coast just east of Waiotahe.
- PAERATA: A Whakatohea pa on hill above beach just east of Waiotahe river.
- PANE-TUKARI: Situated at Te Kahikatea, on the Tahora No.2 block.
- PANE-KAHA: The pa of the Panekaha clan, on the Wainui creek at Ohiwa. Real name of pa apparently lost.
- PAPAROA: A pa at Ohiwa, the Kareke tribe occupied it for a time.
- PUHI-RAKE: An old time Upokorehe pa at Waiotahe, on Mr Chapman's farm.
- PA-TAPU: On range near Ohiwa, Raumoa said to have been killed there.
- TE MAUKU: An old pa site near Kutarere at Ohiwa probably the same as O-Heu pa.
- TE MAWHAI: An ancient pa on the hill just east of Ohiwa ferry near Onekawa pa. Tuamutu lived at Te Mawhai some 15 generations ago (about A.D.1530)

OLD PA SITES OF TE UPOKOREHE

TE POKA: An old pa site of the Panekaha clan, Ohiwa.

TOKO-RANGI: An Upokorehe pa at Wakataua, in the Waiotahe valley.

TUHUA: An Upokorehe pa at Waiotahe near the Orona pa nad near Wakataua.

WHARE-KURA: An ancient pa on Ohiwa harbour near Onekawa pa, about 2 miles from Ohiwa ferry.

"Me kawē ki te uru-rua i Wharekura", was an old time saying in regard to this place on account of it being a large important village.
